Hazardous Materials Narrative: Unit 96 arrived on scene at East I-10 at college drive exit to find a black liquid tar/sludge spill on 2 lanes of the interstate. THe middle lane and right lane already shut down upon arrival of 96. 2 DOTD Map trucks on scene along with Eng 9, Ch 37, 3 BRPD officers for traffic control.
LA DOTD supervisor in charge of the clean up was Albert Shield Jr Dist 61, DOTD 510 unit, Parish Maint Superintendany. 329-7717 231-4190 Sand truck first to arrive DOTD truck # 144-126.
Supervisor instructed us only one 6 yard truck of sand would be needed, despite 96 suggestion to get 2 sand trucks en route to scene. Sand truck 144-126 was broken and inoperable upon arrival and attempt to place in to sand spread gear and belt feed. DOTD supervisor informed us he had 2 more DOTD trucks en route. Later approx 20-30 minutes later upon questioning, DOTD supervisor informed 96 NO other sand trucks were available.
Sand ended up being spread by hand and spread with broom. DOTD brush sweep truck arrived on scene and ended up brushing up and sweeping up some of the tar like material that had dried on the interstate.
After sand sp read out on remaining residue on the interstate, decision made by DOTD to open back up the intersta te and allow the cars passing over to spread out the sand after determining safe to drive on.
96 remained on scene approx 10 minutes to observe traffic flow safety. No safety issues observed.
DOTD supervisor notified us they would come back and sweep up the remaining sand on the interstate later today. A time was not given to us as to when this would happen. T. Achord R. Lambert
